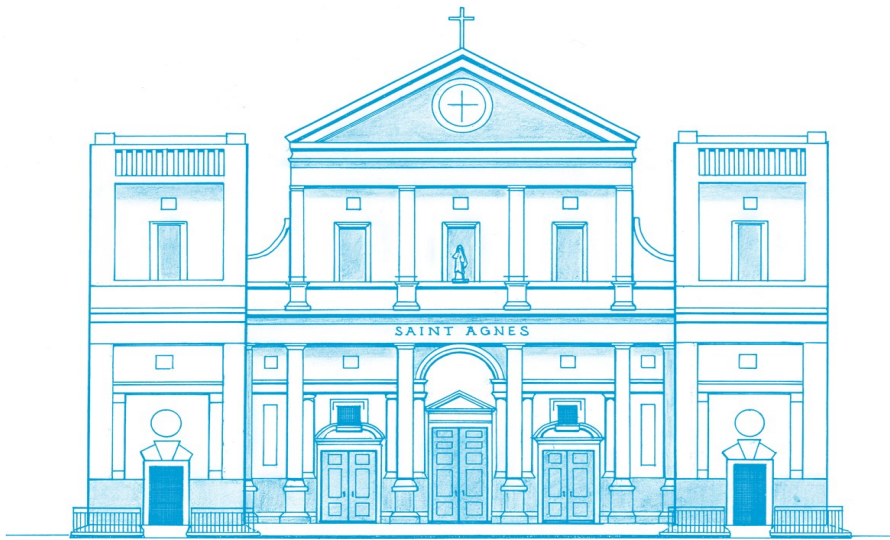

Do you think you are being Called?

If so, the following steps may help:

- ◆ Pray daily. Try to attend daily Mass.
- ◆ Read scripture or any good, Catholic book that appeals to you.
- ◆ Seek counsel from a Priest or Religious. Don't stress out—asking questions isn't a commitment. No one will push you.
- ◆ Pray for courage. Being a Religious is a life of Service and the highest honor given to men and women. It's OK to be a little scared.
- ◆ Ask friends & family for support. Their prayers can help you immensely.
- ◆ Look into retreats or weekends designed to help you. NYPRIEST.com and the St. Agnes bulletin often publish these events. Give them a try!

Praying the Rosary for Vocations

Praying the Rosary for vocations is an excellent way to help the Church. The Lord said, "The harvest is plenty, but laborers are few." He needs help! The word vocation means, literally, a calling. We are in desperate need for men & women to answer God's Call. Today, with a shortage of Religious, we must remember ***there isn't a shortage of Calls***. There is, rather, a shortage of those who Answer. Please pray for those who are Called. Pick up a copy of the "Rosary for Vocations" brochure in the narthex. It contains reflections on the Luminous Mysteries that support

- (1) The universal vocation to be holy,
- (2) Vocations to marriage, (3) Vocations for permanent deacons, (4) Vocations to Religious life, and (5) Vocations to the Priesthood. The Luminous Mysteries focus especially on the public ministry of Christ, so this Rosary is a simple but fruitful prayer for vocations.
