Oppose Assisted Suicide

Legislation has been introduced in NY State that would allow doctors to legally prescribe a lethal dose of pills at the request of a terminally ill patient. While proponents call these bills "death with dignity" and "patient self-determination," in reality they are unnecessary, flawed, and dangerous. Legalizing assisted suicide would endanger elderly, disabled, and vulnerable people. It will send the message to others that suicide is acceptable and lead to an increase in suicides. It will leave people with depression and other mental illness untreated. And, it will turn doctors and other health professionals from healers to killers. We encourage you to contact your state legislators and urge them to oppose assisted suicide legislation. Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in You!

2. *O my Jesus, You have said: "Truly I say to you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name, He will give it to you." Behold, in Your name, I ask the Father for the grace of... (Mention your intention here)*

Pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, one Glory Be.
Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in You!

3. *O my Jesus, You have said: "Truly I say to you, heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away." Encouraged by Your infallible words, I now ask for the grace of... (Mention your intention here)*

Pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, one Glory Be.
Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in You!

Conclude by praying:

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, for whom it is impossible not to have compassion on the afflicted, have pity on us miserable sinners and grant us the grace which we ask of You, through the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, Your tender Mother and ours.

Pray one Hail, Holy Queen, followed by:
St. Joseph, foster father of Jesus, pray for us!
Amen.

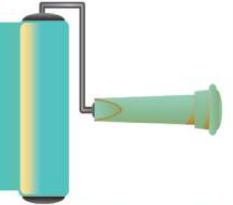
