### ***First Saturday Devotion***

In the Church, Saturday is often dedicated to The Blessed Mother. There are many devotions available to us, but as this year marks the 100th anniversary of Fatima, we might remember that the “First Saturdays” practice came to us from Fatima. What is the “First Saturday Devotion?”

**On the First Saturday during 5 Consecutive Months, the Devotion consists of:**

1. Going to Confession
2. Receiving the Eucharist
3. Saying five decades of the Rosary
4. Meditating for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary

***All this offered in REPARATION for the sins of blasphemy and ingratitude committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.***

The five first Saturdays correspond to the five kinds of offenses and blasphemies committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary. They are:

1. Blasphemies against the Immaculate Conception
2. Blasphemies against her virginity
3. Blasphemies against her divine maternity, at the same time the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all men
4. Instilling indifference, scorn, and even hatred towards this Immaculate Mother in the hearts of children
5. Direct insults against Her sacred images

#### **Tips for the First Saturday Devotion:**

- ◆ Confession may be done on other days other than the First Saturdays so long as one receives Our Lord worthily and has the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- ◆ Even if one forgets to make the intention, it may be done on the next confession, taking advantage of the first occasion to go to confession.
- ◆ It is not necessary to meditate on ALL mysteries of the Rosary on each First Saturdays. One or several suffice.

### **Traditional Latin Mass—NEW TIME!**

The Church of St. Agnes has been pleased to celebrate the Traditional Latin Mass over a number of years and wants to accommodate its current needs.

The Traditional Latin Mass, celebrated at 11:00am on Sundays, has sometimes gone over, making it difficult to celebrate the 12:30pm Mass on time. To allow more time to the Traditional Latin Mass, we are moving it to 9:00am on Sunday, with the next Mass beginning at 11:00am. The current 8:30am Mass will be celebrated at 8:00am.

This change may be an inconvenience for some of the faithful, but it also has its advantages. As it says in *Summorum Pontificum* of Benedict XVI, it “ensures that the good of these members of the faithful is harmonized with the ordinary pastoral care of the parish ... favoring the unity of the whole Church.”

### ***Total Consecration to Jesus Through Mary***

For the 23rd consecutive year, parishioners of St. Agnes are preparing for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as developed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. **The 33-day period of preparation begins on Sunday, August 6th** (the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord). The prayers are said personally and individually, and culminates on Thursday, September 7th with the vigil of the Nativity of The Blessed Mother. The Mass & Consecration on Friday, September 8th, the Feast of the Nativity of The Blessed Virgin Mary, will however be public for all who are prepared to make their Consecration.

**St. Louis de Montfort—the proponent of his True Devotion to Jesus through Mary—brings us closer to Mary who brings us closer to her Son, Jesus Christ. The more one is consecrated to her, the more one is consecrated to Jesus.**

### **Praying the Rosary for Vocations**

Praying the Rosary for vocations is an excellent way to help the Church. The Lord said, "The harvest is plenty, but laborers are few." He needs help! The word vocation means, literally, a calling. We are in desperate need for men & women to answer God's Call. Today, with a shortage of Religious, we must remember ***there isn't a shortage of Calls***. There is, rather, a shortage of those who Answer. Please pray for those who are Called. Pick up a copy of the "Rosary for Vocations" brochure in the narthex. It contains reflections on the Luminous Mysteries that support (1) The universal vocation to be holy, (2) Vocations to marriage, (3) Vocations for permanent deacons, (4) Vocations to Religious life, and (5) Vocations to the Priesthood. The Luminous Mysteries focus especially on the public ministry of Christ, so this Rosary is a simple but fruitful prayer for vocations.
